





7. Please indicate how satisfied you are about the following in Center Harbor?



It seems with expenses rising each year (cost of electricity in town offices, police & fire salaries), the only way the town can offord such increases is to raise taxes. This does not seem a sustainable fiscal strategy. Has the town modeled what the next 10 years look like with expenses rising at the 10-year average, the # of houses & businesses paying taxes remaining flat and other conservative assumptions. What annual property tax increases (%) would homeowners expect? Is this "reasonable"? If not, what options does the town have to raise revenue (beside property taxes) and/or reduce the budget?

The population of Center Harbor is not large enough to support things like a pharmacy or a shopping center. That is why we go to Meredith, Laconia, Plymouth, Concord, and Manchester for those things. Their lack is why we have a rural nature.

Keep our community small and intimate is my preference.






10. Do you feel there is adequate housing available in Center Harbor to meet the future needs of the town?






16. How satisfied are you with the way the Fire Department serves our community? (Please choose one)




18. Have you ever called for an ambulance while in Center Harbor? ²⁰⁵ responses






19. Do you support increasing funding for ambulance services? 192 responses





20. How satisfied are you with the way the Highway Department serves our community? (Please choose one)

Comments regarding Question 22:

Many speeding cars

Speed Limits need to be reviewed and enforced. Center Harbor consists of more than the village area. Intersection on Rte 3 and 25B

The roads in the downtown area are all dangerous to pedestrians, especially in the winter. More sidewalks, ADA compliance, and winter maintenance are needed.

don't find them dangerous. Winona Road curves are worse!

The should be a requirement that ny T intersection must have a 90 foot open view at the corner passing zones on Dane Road 25B

Keep vegetation trimmed down around intersections, ie Waukewan Rd and Rt 3 intersection. Some motorists still speed around the corner on Rt 25-B at the fountain. Visibility is obstructed leaving Kelsea Ave onto Bean Rd.

Mt Whittier Hwy. Traffic moves very fast through section that runs through Center Harbor.

All the salting on 25B create constant well issues down the road with run off. It creates huge burdens on homes and businesses and it something isn't done it will hurt the lake. We constantly get tested by the state about water quality but the issues are created by road salting and fire department (PFAS).

Nobody stops at this intersection despite the stop sign

Lack of sidewalk clearing in winter adds to pedestrian danger by requiring walkers to walk in the street. A committee is working on this problem.

Walking in winter can be challenging from Plymouth St. into town. Kelsea Ave is fine in the winter because one can walk safely on the side of the wide road, plus traffic is limited. Once on Plymouth St, walking on the side of the road is challenging when sidewalks are not available.

Bean Road where it narrows by the old Catholic Church. Both sides of the road are lined with stone walls and a big fence limiting all chance of clearance for a huge semi-truck and car or other big vehicle passing at the same time as a pedestrian or cyclist. Scarey and dangerous for all.

Rt 25b Rt 3 intersection needs realignment to create a 90 degree T, eliminate the parking spot closest to the Lake St. Main St. intersection for better visibility.

Several accidents

I live near College Rd - never had an issue at either Waukewan or 25B intersections and I go thru them often There should be a crosswalk painted on the road as well as signs warning cars of potential pedestrian crossing. It is a very dangerous intersection since it's on a curve and people drive too fast.

Lacking sidewalks (which would be nice) pedestrian crossings with warning lights would be useful. In the rural parts of Town, walkways really aren't needed.

College Rd being used as a short cut by too many people. More speed limit signs needed!




How supportive are you of these efforts in our town?

Comments regarding Question 28:

Land preservation is essential throughout the lakes region, especially towns like Center Harbor with a great deal of lake frontage. Preserving such land helps reduce density at the lakes' edges and also improves the water quality of the lakes. Additional hillside and open land being conserved helps with air pollution and CO2 absorption. Using these funds for that purpose should be a priority.

Therefore 100% of the LUCT should go to the cons com..... though a cost of community services analysis would help inform the decision.

Good balance of conservation and tax reduction







29. How often do you visit the town website? (Please choose one) 205 responses






31. Which type of device do you use most often to access the website? 203 responses
